

A RESOLUTION

Supporting Entering Into a s.66.30 Intergovernmental Agreement  
For Recycling Services with the Southwest Wood County Recycling Commission

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Act 335, the Recycling Law requires each municipality in the State of Wisconsin to provide for the recycling of residential solid waste produced by its residents; and,

WHEREAS, The economics of operating a recycling program are such that a jointly operated program would be beneficial to all municipalities involved; and,

WHEREAS, the municipalities in Southwest Wood County have agreed to work cooperatively to develop and maintain a recycling program for the residents of their respective municipalities; and,

WHEREAS, The Town of Remington has received funds from the Department of Natural Resources for the development and start-up of a recycling program for residential solid waste produced within the community.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of the Town of Remington authorizes the Chairman and Clerk to enter the Town of Remington into an agreement as allowed by Section 66.30 of the Wisconsin Statutes for recycling services with the Southwest Wood County Recycling Commission; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Town of Remington shall transfer to the Southwest Wood County Recycling Commission its Responsible Unit Status for Recycling Services as determined by 1989 Wisconsin Law, Act 335, the Recycling Law; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Remington shall name one (1) delegate to the Commission within thirty (30) days of executing the Municipal Cooperative Agreement for recycling services, as the Commission shall consist of one (1) delegate appointed from each member Municipality; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Remington will fund the Southwest Wood County Recycling Commission on an annual basis, with amount of funding determined by the annual budget process of the Commission. The Commission shall charge each municipality for recycling services based on a per-capita assessment, with population being determined by the U.S. Census Bureau's most current Decennial Census. The per-capita assessment will be equal for all member municipalities in the Commission.
